# 2021 Annual Meeting Report

### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**



Our 2021 metaphysical theme, "Rolling away the stone," amplifies the prayerful work and demonstrations that have taken place this past year - breaking through the beliefs of life in matter or time, and reducing to nothing any

obstructions in our path. Angel visitants were constant companions. How many times have we asked ourselves, "How did that get accomplished?" And then we would smile, fully recognizing the power of prayer and divine Love's leading hand. Much like the journey of Moses and the Israelites, the waters parted and we walked through.

We are also reminded of the disciple Peter seeing Jesus walking on the water, and stepping outside the boat to meet him. Though Peter's acceptance of the material picture started to sink him, the Comforter was there immediately supporting and nursing him, proving that substance is spiritual. The question, "wherefore didst thou doubt?" (Matt 14:31) beckons each of us as we take our own steps to leave the tempest-tossed ships of today and feel the ever-present calm of the Christ, and to know we were never in a tempest-tossed ship to begin with.

Through it all, we continually asked this important question: "What laws of God are in place and what are we learning and understanding about the divine nature?" For example, "Divine Love always has met..." - the totality of this five-word law - operates to the complete exclusion and obliteration of time, chance, space, chaotic lawless activity, division, and polarization.

So, while safely, practically, and lovingly caring for our patients - the real work for our Christian Science nurses and staff is to constantly commune with God, to learn more about these divine laws and then apply them to our daily work.

Mary Baker Eddy tells us to resolve things into thought, and the collective demonstration that is our new building is a good example of this. We have seen firsthand how all is thought - spiritual ideas that come forward manifesting themselves as expressions of divine symbols. As we were holding to the completeness of Christian Science nursing, founded within the structure of Truth and Love, these ideas naturally manifested themselves in a higher sense of place that came forward to meet the need perfectly.

The following are a few highlights:

- We continued to give heartfelt, loving, practical Christian Science nursing care while finalizing the last stages of the new building project, including permitting, inspections, and punch lists
- We coordinated all the training needed for the new building's systems, technology, emergency protocols, and space setup

Each Peace Haven Trustee is deeply grateful for our demonstration of supply, protection and care this past year. This is evident from the exceptional, dedicated service of our Christian Science nurses who - each day, all day and

night - watch and care, and promote healing, for those in their charge. It is evident from the devoted work of our administrative staff, including our Executive Director, who watch over the day-to-day operations, ensuring the constant presence of a healing environment. And, it is evident from every one of our employees who selflessly provide the services needed to make Peace Haven a haven for those in need of healing. Words alone are insufficient to express the extent of our gratitude.

We are, of course, grateful for the timely and cost-efficient completion of our new facility. Our gratitude for those who contributed to this, first prayerfully and then financially, is unbounded. We are reminded of Mary Baker Eddy's description of the original edifice of The Mother Church: "our prayer in stone." When applied to Peace Haven, with the sincere prayers of those supporting Christian Science nursing, this makes evident it is the promise of what is accomplished in our new structure that is most important, fulfilling our mission of "meeting the human need" individually and collectively, conflicting elements must be by providing Christian Science nursing care for those wholly relying on Christian Science for healing," not the

structure itself.

We are mindful that now is the time for fidelity to Mrs. Eddy's demand that we be awake and alert. She cautions us to be alert to our duty to "defend [ourselves] daily against aggressive mental suggestion . . . ." (Manual, 42:5-7) The world, she reminds us, is constantly telling us of the things we ought to fear or be concerned about. But we have Mrs. Eddy's promise that, as "Christians," we "rejoice in secret beauty and bounty, hidden from the world, but known to God" (Science and Health 15:25-26).

The work to be accomplished is right before us. Here, from a 1903 letter, Mrs. Eddy wrote to her "Beloved Brethren," something important for us to know about the "world," and how we ought to respond. She says:

"I have a secret to tell you and a question to ask. Do you know how much I love you and the nature of this love? No: then my sacred secret is incommunicable, and we live apart. But, yes: and this inmost something becomes articulate, and my book is not all you know of me ... Difficulty, abnegation, constant battle against the world, the flesh, and evil, tell my long-kept secret - evidence a heart wholly in protest and unutterable in love."

She continues with this promise:

"The unprecedented progress of Christian Science is proverbial, and we cannot be too grateful nor too humble for this, inasmuch as our daily lives serve to enhance or to stay its glory. To triumph in truth, to keep the faith mastered. ... Joy over good achievements and work well done should not be eclipsed by some lost opportunity,

Mary Baker Eddy states in Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures that "the chief cornerstone of all spiritual building is purity" (Science and Health 241: 24-27). She further declares that "Jesus established his church and maintained his mission on the spiritual foundation of Christ healing" (Science and Health 136:1-2).

So, it is with the cornerstone of purity (in thought and action) and the foundation of Christ healing, that Peace Haven has spent the past year moving forward, reflecting the Christ light, and experiencing the radiant glow of exact and permanent healing. It has been the focus on steadfast prayer and the Christian Science healing nursing ministry that has enabled Peace Haven to demonstrate the holy Good that has overcome the false images of financial challenges, pandemics, and human medical outlines and limitations that try to clamor for power and recognition.

When reading through the New Testament in the Bible, one is struck by the beautiful healings demonstrated by Christ Jesus and his disciples. The same is true in the Fruitage chapter of Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures by Mrs. Eddy. In every case, the Christ presence of divine Love brought healing to all.

This healing Love is so evident in the atmosphere of Peace Haven and its practical and inspired Christian Science nursing ministry. As soon as one opens the door to this peaceful sanctuary, the "still, small voice" of Love warms the heart and shines forth in healing outreach -"Love, redolent with unselfishness, bathes all in beauty and light" (Science and Health 516: 12-13).

From the bright and gracious surroundings and the wonderful, practical provision of meals, comfort, cleanliness, and compassion - to the healing thoughts of all toward each other and the guests - the Christian Science nursing,



hospitality, administration, and facility/maintenance staffs reflect and provide this beautiful Soul-filled atmosphere that provides remarkable and demonstrable healing results - divine Love in action.

This past year - with the financing of the new building and an operating budget of nearly \$4 million - Peace Haven moved forward gracefully with a balanced budget (for our fifth consecutive year) and no outstanding debt. This was accomplished while providing our many varied services (from skilled nursing, light assistance, and sheltered care, to Christian Science nurses training through the Christian Science Nursing Arts program, including mentoring support) - all with harmony and gentleness of thought and action.

Here are a few additional very positive highlights:

- Our new building is now fully paid for. It was completed on-time, and we moved into it eight months ago.
- We serviced guests from Canada as well as from 10 states (West: CA AZ; East: ME, VT; Midwest: MO, IL, KS, CO, OK, AL).
- Our individual donor base grew by 8%.



It was a powerful moment of realization that we stand on the

shoulders of these workers, our extended family whose work laid the foundation of scientific proof of the efficacy of Christian Science healing now and forever. It is the same Christ presence, impossible to diminish, the same powerful truth right where we stand and always will be meeting every human need.

# What Are We Really Giving? BRIAN WEBSTER

### DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT



At Peace Haven, when we invite friends to consider making a financial contribution in support of this healing ministry, our invitation stems from a recognition that each one of us gives of our "...heart's rich overflow..." (Hymnal 139: 3).

When you've been invited to give, have either of these thoughts ever come to you? "I don't have enough to give," or "When I have more, I'll be able to give."

The world tries to convincingly argue that we can only give from our material abundance. Jesus suggested just the opposite. When the poor widow placed her two mites in the treasury, he said, "... this poor widow hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury: For all they did cast in of their abundance; but she of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living," (Mark 12:43, 44).

The widow to whom Elisha spoke claimed she had nothing to give to keep the creditors away "...save a pot of oil," (II Kings 4). She did not realize that her abundance did not come from the oil, but came from her thought about the oil she had.

In both instances, it came down to thought. Limited thinking suggests that it is the material experience that determines our mental state. Christian Science affirms it is thought that determines our experience. When we understand this, we see more and more that the pool from which we draw our abundance is not material, but spiritual, and therefore limitless. Thus, we demonstrate that the pot we have for giving is literally bottomless, and how true it is that "...freely [we] have received, freely [we can] give," (Matt. 10:8).

Giving is not just pouring out good. It is always a two-way proposition. Jesus' counsel includes this promise: "Give, and you will receive. Your gift will return to you in full–pressed down, shaken together to make room for more, running over, and poured into your lap. The amount you give will determine the amount you get back," (Luke 6:38, NLT).

Giving without any thought to receiving is best of all. This spiritual state is so consciously aware of God's boundless provision that it entertains no element of need or limitation. Free of these, the giver is liberated to be the pure reflection of God, who is all-abundance. This is why giving is so fulfilling. It is the fulfilling of the law.
